listed here.

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy.

Trousers and shorts Grover black

Grey or black (no jeans!)

Tights Grey or black



The uniform is a branded jumper - not a plain jumper. They are available from our uniform suppliers (see bottom of sheet). Jumpers are available as a sweatshirt or a cardigan.

A branded fleece jacket is also available.

Please label all clothing



Dress

Blue gingham summer dress

Grey/black pinafore dress or skirt

Skorts are fine if grey or black and of a sensible length



Shoes

Shoes should be: black and sturdy (to offer protection when children are at play).
Boots are fine in the

winter months – they should be black, as plain as possible, and of a sensible style, please.

But please no:

- × canvas
- × open-toed sandals
- × trainers
- \times high heels

Why bother with a uniform?

White polo (plain/branded)

or

white cotton

We love our Southill School uniform, even though the children aren't always as keen. We think it's important to wear a uniform for many reasons:

- to create a feeling of pride in children's appearance and themselves
- to provide a sense of togetherness and teamwork
- to reduce distraction away from learning
- to create a sense of order and purpose in the school
- to reduce peer pressure about the clothes children might otherwise wear.

Most parents try hard to support our uniform policy and so it is not fair on the majority if individual children wear anything very different. Please help us by sticking to the guidelines.
