We'll be learning about creepy crocs and amazing alligators, the deadly assassin bug and the voracious Venus flytrap. We'll be inspired to write an informative leaflet all about our favourite predator and compose a poem about a predator or its prey. Then we'll use what we know about the best of the beasts to create the ultimate predator; the apex of the food chain. Cross a dad with a peregrine falcon or nan with a great white shark! We'll be imagining some incredible species. Feeling peckish? We'll jump aboard the food chain, too.

As **scientists** we will be making observations which involve looking closely at objects, materials and living things. We'll be comparing and grouping them according to their features, as well as identifying similarities, differences and changes.
