All young musicians are invited to join the Dorset Youth Jazz Orchestra for a fun day of playing jazz! Musicians can choose between two sessions – a morning session for experienced players and an afternoon session for less experienced players. The sessions are FREE to attend!

Session 1 (10:00am-1:00pm) is aimed at more experienced players (approximately Grade 4 standard and above) and will be led by renowned local jazz saxophonist, Terry Quinney. The session will be a fun, play-along rehearsal with the Dorset Youth Jazz Orchestra (DYJO), finishing with a mini-concert at 12:30pm to families and to those attending the afternoon session.

Session 2 (12:30pm-3:00pm) is aimed at less experienced players (approximately Grade 2-3 standard) and will be led by renowned trumpeter and educator, Sam Massey. The session will be a fun introduction to jazz ensemble playing and will begin with the opportunity for students and families to listen to the mini-concert performed by DVJO and guests.
