Milk, snack and hot meals



- School meals are provided and are cooked on site.
 The meals are free for children in Reception.
- Children in Reception can have milk each day (free for children under 5) with their snack.
- Snack time is a quiet time of the day where we all sit together and chat. Free fruit is delivered each day.

Preparing your child for school

A few ideas:

Transition process


What next?
