PE Day: come to school in PE kit

From September, we would like to trial a new system where children will be asked to come to school in their PE kit one day a week. Instead of each child having their own kit in a bag on their peg, we would like children to come to school in their PE kit on their designated PE day. We believe it will be easier for parents, pupils and staff and will make things better for many reasons:

- Gaining teaching time that is lost when children get changed (which is a significant amount for very young children)
- Doing away with the anxiety many face over public changing
- Doing away with the need for separate changing areas for our older children
- Helping pupils with additional needs
- Reducing battles over forgotten kit
- Reducing lost property.

Your children will be asked to keep PE kit at home. They can wear uniform for four days, and PE kit for one. We will confirm the day of your class PE at the start of next term but are letting you know now as it may affect your plans for buying new uniform over the summer.

A reminder of our PE kit requirements:

- Pegasus/Dragon/Griffin/Phoenix coloured T-shirt
- Black or blue shorts
- Plimsolls/trainers
- In cold weather, children should wear their school jumper and you can add tracksuit trousers.
